BERNIE'S MUSIC UPDATE

utumn has arrived in Minneapolis! The church year is winding down, but we are also planning for the renewal of Advent and Christmas. While the days of the year wane, we plan for the upcoming holidays culminating in New Year's Day.

One way we celebrate and commemorate in worship is through music. Who gets to celebrate with music? We ALL do! Wait, do I have that right? Let's check my work in the Psalms to be sure.

Psalm 66 says, "Make a joyful noise to God, all the earth; sing the glory of God's name."

Who gets to make a joyful noise? The cantor, the choir, trained musicians? No, all the earth!

Psalm 95 tells us, "O come, let us sing to the Lord; let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation!"

Let US sing, shouts the psalmist: all of us make a joyful noise.

Psalms contains six references to "joyful noise," four references to "music," and 66 references to "song." One

reason for this is that the book of Psalms is the Bible's songbook. It is a collection of hymns that were sung in worship. The only reason we do not know the original tunes of the Psalms is because there was no musical notation at the time. To demonstrate this, find the Psalms in our "Cranberry Book" or ELW (Evangelical Lutheran Worship). Psalms 1 - 150 are followed by hymn number 151 in the upper corner of the page.

I invite you to sing with full hearts in worship and on your own as you praise and pray toGod.

I also invite you to come sing with the Bethel Choir, ring with the Handbell Choir, or join us to play percussion, guitar, or bass. I am seeking percussionists to assist in some of our worship songs, and I am happy to teach you some basic techniques. If you walk down the street whistling a tune, sing around the house, beat-box, or dance around the kitchen,

give us a try!

MICHELLE'S GRANTS UPDATE



GIVE TO THE MAX DAY AT BETHEL THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 21, 2024

Appy November! This year Bethel will participate in Minnesota's "Giving Holiday," so plan to give on Thursday, November 21. This year, the funds raised through Give to the Max Day will be used for new ministry exploration to offer a Queer Safe and Sober Space at Bethel.

Recently there has been legislation in many states attempting to limit folx in their self-expression and self-determination, particularly folx who are transgender. Bethel is a Reconciling in Christ Congregation, committed to the full inclusion and celebration of people who recognize themselves to be in the LGBTQIA+ spectrum.

Bethel can intentionally and explicitly use our space to allow sober queer folx to determine what they need from a church. We will offer space for this group of folx to use and we will walk alongside them in their journey.

This year the funds we raise together through Give to the Max Day will be matched 2:1! For every dollar you give, we will receive \$2 in matching funds from the Lenore Bevis memorial! These funds will help facilitate conversations, conduct research, reach out, and try some ideas for what Queer Safe and Sober Space would look like. If you want to be part of the team, contact Pastor Brenda.

This year, plan to give at least \$20 (with the match, that's \$60!) and invite three other people to join you in giving to this ministry project. Watch your email and around the church for more details on how to Give to the Max on Thursday, November 21, 2024!

FEASIBILITY UPDATE

our Feasibility Study Team continues to pursue and discuss ideas for Bethel's property in the future. Right now we have been focused on three areas:

- We are working with our lawyers and Crown Castle, the company who owns the monopole in our parking lot, to be sure we have full understanding of our monopole contract and know what our options are for the parking lot, should a future plan for Bethel include that space.
- El Colegio High School, the charter school on 42nd and Bloomington that uses our building frequently, may be interested in a more permanent use of more of our space. We have been in

conversation with them and expect to find out more this fall about future possibilities.

• We feel strongly that we want to involve the neighborhood as we continue in our Feasibility Study work, and we are searching for a professional organization that can facilitate a Neighborhood Impact Study. Such a study would help us to gain a better understanding of what our neighbors think about Bethel and to use this knowledge to help us make decisions based on their potential effects on the neighborhood.

MISSION COUNCIL REPORT

The October Mission Council meeting was held on the first chilly night of the year, a reminder of the changing of the seasons and the coming of winter. We reviewed the Fall Festival and are happy with the success - especially because it was the first time the festival was held. Already, we are working on ideas for next year. A big THANK YOU to Regan, who put so much work into organizing the Fall Festival.

We discussed the upcoming Trunk or Treat to be held in the Bethel parking lot on October 27, 5-6:30 PM. It promises to be a fun, well-attended event. The Mission Council is looking at potential membership with the Mental Health Connect (MHC) program. They are a collaborative of faith communities working to ensure everyone has access to mental health care and working to reduce the stigma of mental illness. We also reviewed the proposed calendar of events for 2025. We are working to schedule our events in ways that will bring efficiency and increase participation.

The Mission Council is getting ready to review Bethel's Mission Statement at the request of the Feasibility Committee.
