### Merry Christmas and a Happy and Healthy 2022!

During the Advent season I prevent myself from listening to Christmas music until we have worshiped together on the fourth Sunday of Advent. Which means that I have been listening to Christmas music now for four days. I have been struck by two sets of songs this week that combine some very familiar songs, *Silent Night, Holy Night*, and *What Child Is This*, with *Night of Silence* and *Child of the Poor*, respectively.

I truly appreciate these song combinations because they include a harsh honesty of what Jesus' birth was actually like, and the world in which he was born and in which we live here and now. Life is not all shining stars and beautiful babies, but includes the challenges and truths of the season and our reality.

Here is part of the song *Child of the Poor*, sung with and over the top of *What Child Is This:* 

Helpless and hungry, lowly, afraid Wrapped in the chill of midwinter; Comes now, among us, born into poverty's embrace New life for the world

Who is this? Who lives with the lowly? Sharing their sorrows Knowing their hunger? This is Christ revealed to the world In the eyes of a child, a child of the poor.

# Bethel awarded \$8000 grant for Bethel Youth Project 2022

Last year, before Easter, I had a strong desire to share with our Bethel youth an Easter tradition I had picked up while volunteering for the Lutheran Volunteer Corps. You see, when you commit to being an LVC volunteer, you commit to three things: a year of living in intentional Christian community, working for social justice, and living simply. One of the things my LVC house and I did together was learn to dye eggs using natural ingredients—blueberry juice, beet juice, turmeric, coffee grounds, etc. What I REALLY wanted to do was dye eggs with the youth in person, but in light of COVID precautions, I decided to film the process of dying eggs naturally and post it on our website. I asked Lizzy Kile if she would help me film the natural egg dying process. And what happened next knocked my socks off.

Within minutes, Lizzy and the two friends she brought over had set up multiple camera shots from different perspectives, filmed the egg dying, and started editing the video. The three of them finished in an hour what would have taken me, I don't know HOW long, maybe five+hours! AND my product would not have looked as snazzy and professional as what Lizzy, Simona, and Andre produced.

Later that summer, my partner, Dave's, niece came for a visit. She is at the University of lowa studying communications. She told us that she also worked for her church back in Chicago while studying in lowa. I was curious what role she played for her church. Her church, which is one of those mega churches with multiple campuses, hired Sarah to be their social media marketing staff person. So what Sarah did was to post things about church/events (people send her material)/theology/ethics and so forth to Facebook, Instagram and TikTok. She showed me some of her work, and I was dutifully impressed.

This fall, an evangelical marketing organization that I follow closely announced they were offering up to \$8,000 grants for marketing ideas from churches. I love this organization. If anyone knows how to reach out to people, it's evangelicals! They absolutely know how to use technology and social media to connect with people, something in which the ELCA churches lag behind.

So when I saw this grant announcement I spoke to Bethel's Marketing Group about how exciting it was to work with the kids on this video project and told them about Sarah. What we came up with is now called the Bethel Youth Project 2022. What it entails is recruiting and training youth inside and outside our church to facilitate Bethel's social media presence and develop our communications capacity. We are teaming up with local marketing agency Greater Thought to professionally train youth for this purpose. Youth need to apply to the program as interns and after completing several assigned tasks will receive \$500. We hope to provide marketable skills to young people, involve unchurched kids in our faith community, and build intergenerational relationships.

The staff is excited about this project and so are several of the young people I've spoken with. You will be hearing more about our progress in the year to come!






