Pastor’s Ponderings: Listening Into Our Future

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This morning on my drive to Bethel I caught the last 15 minutes of a program on MPR about how the Church needs to change into the future. I have been looking for the podcast this morning, in order to listen and learn from another point of view. I am always curious about what people are saying about the past, present, and future of the Church. How about you?

I also find myself optimistic about our Discovery Day event this coming Saturday, January 28. I am in prayer about this day being a great jumping off point to our future, while honoring our past and our present in ways that celebrate our community. As you read this, I hope you too saw that day as productive and positive.

In my prayers, ponderings, conversations, and times of listening, I have learned that we, and most all congregations, need to find new ways TO BE CHURCH in our society today. That is, we can no longer rely on people “going church shopping” and becoming

members of our congregation with a simple visit. In fact, we may even come to understand that people are not looking to become members of any place until they are extremely convinced that this or that organization fits and feels right with their own beliefs and morals.

Said another way, for many years the Church would create space for newcomers (of any age) to first BELIEVE there is a God, then come to church and learn how to BEHAVE a certain way to fit into this particular congregation, and finally feel a sense of BELONGING to this particular community of believers. Some might say, the Church asked newcomers to assimilate into who we are, and then they could actually be allowed to become members.

Today, this is not how generations of people look at their faith practices, or membership to any organization. Instead, folks are looking **first** for a place to BELONG.

- A place where they are not only welcomed but listened to,
- and not only listened to but able to engage in deep conversation with,
- and not only that but we need to be willing to adjust to the ever-changing climate of what it looks like to be a believer.

Now, generations of people need to know they can trust a church and be included in ways that are fluid and flexible so that they can find a sense of BELONGING. Once that happens, these same people come to BELIEVE in what makes sense to them and is consistent with what they have learned so far in those deep conversations. Then, finally, they may agree to BEHAVE - or better yet, BECOME an active representative of said congregation.

There are various authors who have argued about the order in which Jesus and the Church have engaged with the public in general. Although there remains a debate about in which order the BEHAVE/BECOME and BELIEVE should be considered, all agree that now, in our day and age, **BELONGING must come first.**

Which begs the questions, what makes us feel like we belong? How can we create/reform ourselves into a place of BELONGING first? What is it that offers a sense of belonging from a place that has a long and varied history of wanting people to first believe and behave before one can belong? What does this change actually look like?

In some ways, our Oust Loneliness project has been assisting us in this process. We have invited folks to feel a sense of belonging in various ways on our property and in our building. More and more folks are on our property because we have a labyrinth, basketball court, natural playground, and the like. Because of this, these people might be more likely to step into our building or call our phone number when they need help or have questions.

There are some weeks that I spend time in my office assisting with something that has been posted on Nextdoor. Maybe there is a concern in the community and I know where someone can find a solution, so I offer a resource. Maybe someone has material they want to give away and I connect to see if that material would be useful for our quilts or school bags. Maybe someone needs some diapers, and I check to see if we have the needed size in our Little Free Pantry and set them aside while I set up a pickup or drop-off time. By being this sort of neighbor on Nextdoor, people know who we are as Bethel Lutheran Church. Our neighbors refer others to Bethel for assistance, or to find a 12-step meeting, or to see if Pr Brenda can help.

These are all small ways that we can help folks feel a sense of belonging here at Bethel. In what other ways do you think we offer a sense of belonging?

Michelle's Message



Recently here at Bethel we have been engaged in a lot of reflective work. It is not easy, but also it is not as hard as we might imagine it to be. Perhaps you, like me, can feel a bit impatient with reflective and process questions. "How are you as you come into this meeting?" "How was this meeting for you?"

These questions invite us into honest evaluation of our experiences, and sometimes sharing our honest experiences can feel daunting. What if I feel out of sorts or on edge? What if I would really rather be somewhere else? Am I allowed to say that?

Yes! You are allowed to feel, and acknowledge, and say how you are feeling! In fact, it is helpful for all of us. Likely, you are not the only one feeling that, but if you are, your honesty can help the rest of us be more aware of one another and our own feelings.

Jesus invites us into honest and real relationships. Think about the disciples on the road to Emmaus. That very day two of them were going to a village named Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem, and talking with each other about all these things that had happened. While they were talking and discussing together, Jesus drew near and went with them (Luke 24:13-15).

As they listened to and shared from their experiences, the disciples were trying to make sense of Jesus' death through honest conversation. And you may remember that they did not recognize Jesus as he walked with them. At one point they asked Jesus, "Are you the only one who doesn't know what's going on?" They all stayed in the conversation together, listening and sharing. By the end of their journey, they ate a meal and they belonged to one another.

This is true for us too! When we are willing and able to listen actively and speak intentionally, we share the fullness of our lives (the good, the hard, the uncomfortable, and the confusion) with one another. In truth, this is the way we belong to one another.

So, if you are feeling impatient with the process of reflection and wondering, lean into it! Practice patience! Listen to one another a little more closely, share your experience a little more often, notice what happens—in you and around you—when you do this.

In response to some feedback and discernment from various groups and people, we are going to try something new for Lent this year.

We will have two Ash Wednesday worship times.

- One will be at 12 noon, for those wanting to come to worship before dark. This service will be in the sanctuary and include a soup lunch.
- One will be at 6 pm for those who are still working. This service will be less formal, kid-friendly, and include a meal for everyone who attends.

We will not have anything new on Wednesday nights. We already have Open Gym, Open Sanctuary, Bell Choir Practice, and Choir Practice that night.

Instead we will do something different on **Thursday nights during Lent**. So, Thursdays, March 2- 30, we will serve a free, kid-friendly meal to anyone who wants to come, then offer an one-hour open gym, open sanctuary, presentation/topic for discussion option, and provide child care for little ones so the parents or other caretakers get a short break from the kids. Topics of discussion/presentations are currently being planned.



Bethel Mission Council

The January Mission Council meeting centered around the Loneliness Project – now called the Oust Loneliness Project. We looked at what has been accomplished since we received funding prior to the pandemic. Some of the council's projects include wayfinding signs throughout our property, landscaping, the natural playground, Christmas and Lenten packages delivered to shut-ins and others, and online movies with discussion. The pandemic required us to find new and different ways to connect with our members and with the community.

Mission Council members will be participating in the Discovery Day at the end of January to talk about our "Why" and help to plan the future of Bethel. At our February Mission Council meeting we will continue to discuss and set goals for 2023.

Some of what we learned at the Personal Safety Event (mentioned on page 9)

We started out getting a better understanding of the 'Four A's of Personal Safety':

- **AWARE**- be aware. Become more aware of risks in your everyday life.
- **ACT**- act, do things that reduce risks around your environment.
- **ANTICIPATE**- quickly recognize risks as they occur around you.
- **AVOID**- actively avoid. Take action to avoid risks as they happen in front of you.

We learned some Verbal De-escalation strategies:

- **Active listening:** When people are in conflict or being aggressive towards others, they often do not feel seen or heard. Use your body and facial expressions to fully take in and listen to the person or people. Reflect back to the person what you're hearing, e.g., "I hear that you feel ignored," etc.
- **Empathize:** When a person feels validated, it can reduce tension and increase their ability to follow directions, receive accountability, or negotiate a situation. Focus on speaking to the person from their perspective. Use phrases like "I understand how that is hard," "I agree with you," "You're right, that is a problem."
- **Evade/Escape:** Sometimes the best way to de-escalate a situation is to evade or escape it, or to help a person who is being targeted to get away. Evading can include moving yourself and other affected people away from the incident to a safer space. Or if you're witnessing harassment or violence directed at a stranger, one way you can help someone escape is by pretending to know them. You might say, "Hey, it's so good to see you!" in order to start a conversation with the person and begin to see what sort of support they could use.
- **Use your voice:** Your vocal tone, the pace at which you're speaking, and volume can all be used to convey calm, respect, or power as needed. When a person is agitated, it can help to speak slightly slower or more quietly than them while focusing your body language on them. This will encourage them to work to listen, which may make them more present and able to listen to your directions or the boundaries of others.




