PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Good day dear children of God,

friend of mine from Ohio came and visited friends and family this past month and we had a whole afternoon of delightful, hard, and meaningful conversations. One statement she made continues to stick with me, and I appreciate that it has stayed. She said, "My aunt always taught me that if you have time to worry, you have time to pray."

Now maybe some of you have heard this statement before, but not me. It makes so much sense, and has given me a boost to remember that God is always here, in the midst of the chaos that we call *'LIFE'*.

We spent the afternoon talking about politics, religion, broken relationships, difficult prognoses, and the hard work all people must do to become who God created each of us to be. Indeed, we know each other well enough to know how much work each of us have had to do to become who we are today. We also know there is still room for us to learn more about God's intention for us. As you may be able to guess, we had a wonderful afternoon.

This reminded me of a story about my mom, Belva. Mom used to work at an intake office in Webster County (lowa) where she and two other co-workers would work with people who needed WIC, SNAP, energy assistance, and the like. There was one woman who came to the office on a regular basis and mom's two co-workers were always very frustrated with her. To the point of every time they saw this woman approaching the

office they would both say, "Belva, you get this one!" Mom would agree.

Each time my mom would sit with her and get all the information needed to apply for whatever assistance was needed that day. The woman would complain about everything in life, and mom would listen and cleverly get the information needed. The woman would leave carrying a little smaller burden on her back, and my mom would be just fine. She did not need to vent or complain about the woman. This always surprised her co-workers.

"Belva, how do you tolerate her so well? We cannot stand that woman." And my mom's immediate answer was, "Oh, well as soon as I see her in the parking lot, I start praying for her and I do not stop until she steps out the door."

Friends, this is another lesson I have learned about prayer, and I hope both lessons stick with me the rest of my life. Prayer changes things! Maybe we do not see the end results immediately or even in our lifetime, but prayer changes things. We may notice the change it makes in our own lives, heart, and soul – even if we never see a change in someone or something else.

When I teach confirmation class, I often talk about prayer and the different ways that we can pray. I include a list something like this (not all inclusive):

- Siren prayers every time you hear a siren, pray for everyone involved
- Worry prayers if something is heavy on your heart, pray
- Bandaid prayers someone is hurt, pray for them (include yourself)

- Body prayers we do it every Sunday together
- Whisper prayers, shouting prayers, silent prayers, popcorn prayers
- Color your prayers, journal your prayers, breathe your prayers, meditate
- Prayers of thanksgiving, confession, help, concerns, praise, faith, hope
- Prayers for a new day, meal, protection, peace, kindness, bedtime

The list goes on and on and on and on. *Please, dear* ones, always remember that prayer changes things and God is always listening.

Hello Everyone,

I am writing this update just a few days after our July 10th Community Fun Night, which was a blast. We grilled some hot dogs, spontaneously shared a meal with our friends at CANMN, and had fun learning some basic dance steps for salsa, bachata, cha-cha, and more. Whether you were the next dance prodigy or holding on to the rhythm for dear life, it was such a joy to share this evening with all of you who could attend. I also can't stop thinking about how much fun it would be to hold a similar event someday on our PATIO!

Yes, I am thrilled to announce that the grant application I mentioned in my last update was approved! The Southside Legacy Fund has granted us a helpful sum to get our plans for the renovation of the West Entrance in motion. The project is still very much in its early stages, but now we have the opportunity to dream about all that this multi-use patio space can be. I'd like to include a passage from the application that we submitted, because I think our former grant manager, Rev. Michelle Lewis, did an amazing job of imagining its potential:

"We [...] envision using the space as a way to continue to shift the purpose of our building and our facilities, from an insidefocus to a neighbor-focus.

Can you hear the outdoor concerts on the deck? Can you

see the Raptors demonstration? Can you feel the soft fur of the rabbits that the MN Companion Rabbit organization has brought to the Bethel deck for a program? Grab a cup of coffee and a pastry from the food truck at the curb and join us for a fun Saturday morning or Thursday evening in the summer."

I, of course, can't make any promises that there will in fact be companion rabbits on the deck at some point in the future, but I encourage you to dream about what Bethel can be to the community, and what projects like this can mean. No matter how the final details shake out, or when it is ultimately finished, I know that this patio will be a wonderful addition to our outdoor space and a great way to connect with our neighbors.

One final housekeeping note before I sign off: if you signed up to sponsor an upcoming project with a Thrivent Action Team grant and have not applied for the grant yet, please get in touch or stop by the office so we can help you with your application. The Feasibility Study Team is beginning its third year of work. We've done a lot of exploring in two years but are still looking for the best fit for Bethel for the future. At this time we are working on three main areas:

- 1. Circling back to contacts we have made in the past that weren't interested in further conversations with us at the time but may be ready to talk now.
- 2. Finding out more about the lease and contract regarding the monopole in our parking lot. Legal terms may affect possibilities for future/new uses of our parking lot.

3. Reaching out to Luther Seminary, which will be selling its property and going mostly online. Maybe they would be interested in using Bethel as a physical space for some of their needs – it's an idea worth exploring!


